Location Knowledge	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas
Place Knowledge	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area of the United Kingdom and of a contrasting non-European country
Human and Physical Geography	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom• Identify the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles• Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic physical features
Geographical skills and fieldwork	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied• Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment• Devise simple maps and use and construct basic symbols in a key
