Our school vision is underpinned by two verses from the Bible. We have recently altered one of these so that it truly reflects our aim in encouraging each other to be like Jesus. We believe that the verse from Luke 2:52 sums this up:

#### And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and people. (Luke 2:52)

Like Jesus, we want to enable the children to grow mentally (in wisdom), physically (in stature), spiritually (in favour with God) and socially (in favour with people).

Our second Bible verse describes what it means to grow in wisdom, which goes far beyond academia.

# But the wisdom from above is pure first of all; it is also peaceful, gentle, and friendly; it is full of compassion and produces a harvest of good deeds; it is free from prejudice and hypocrisy. (James 3:17)

Being peaceful, gentle, friendly and full of compassion are just some of the Christian values that we expect all members of our school community to exhibit. Here at Whitegate, we pride ourselves in the positive relationships that we establish. As it says in our Relationships Policy (formally our Behaviour Policy) our school is a place where everyone should be able to flourish in a loving and hospitable community. Let us continue to treat each other with kindness and respect.

#### **Christmas Productions**

#### **Christmas Fair**

A huge thank you to our amazing FOWS team for putting on a very successful Christmas Fair. It was great to see the whole school community coming together. #### Anti-bullying
