Water bottles

Thank you for your support this week in not sending in water bottles. Whilst we know some children have slightly struggled to adjust, your support in the matter has helped them a great deal. The decision to move away from water bottles was made for several reasons. First, children in all classes were often forgetting to bring them into school, resulting in them going thirsty as they sometimes wouldn't let staff know or ask for a cup. We also noticed that some bottles were not always being regularly cleaned and that some children were using old Prime bottles or other unsuitable containers. Finally, and most importantly, all of the children drinking from the same size cups allows us to properly monitor how much children are drinking over the course of the day. Proper hydration is key for good physical and mental health; we have already noticed the benefits for some children now that we are more able to support them in drinking sufficient amounts. Again, thank you for your support and understanding in this matter.
