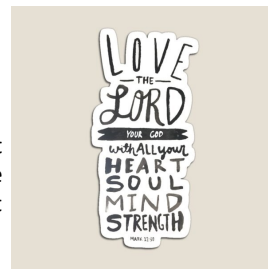
Collective Worship

This half-term we are focusing on the Christian value of 'Love'. So far, we have looked at the Bible verse in Mark's gospel:

'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

This was Jesus' response to the question, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"

We have explored what Jesus meant by 'love your neighbour' and how we can do this. We have also thought about the end of this verse where Jesus tells us the importance of loving ourselves. We have looked at the 'Mental Health Foundation' and what good mental health looks like. The children have been able to suggest lots of ways to look after themselves mentally, including less screen time and more time out in the fresh air.
