I also remind you to be polite and courteous if a villager speaks to you about where you are parked. Please can you also pass these messages onto grandparents who pick up. I witnessed first-hand a grandparent react in an extremely rude manner to the chair of the Parish Council when he asked her not to park on the double yellow lines opposite school. This was also in front of the child, teaching them that it is okay not to follow rules.

#### Attendance Policy

#### Homework

At Whitegate, we do not believe in setting lots of homework, especially tasks that require lots of input from you as parents and carers. We do however, expect that all children read four times a week and that they also access Numbots or Times Tables Rockstars (TTRS). In school, we are able to monitor when and for how long children are engaging in Numbots and TTRS and it is disappointing to see that so many children are not logging on to complete the tasks. In Year 4, the children have to sit a statutory multiplication check. This is because in order to access the Year 5 and 6 maths curriculum, children must know their times tables; therefore, I cannot stress enough the importance that they do this homework. They should be able to log-on without adult support as they do so in school. Thank you for your co-operation with this.
